

How many hearts are on the page? Color the hearts to honor Kim. Draw a picture of Kim or something that reminds you of her.







### is for Bloomster

Color the picture of Dorm B. Draw a picture of Dorm A.






#### is for Centennial

It's been orphanage and daycare, a place for troubled youth, too, Now it's Personal Care, they're great at all that they do.


Color the banner. Can you draw or write 100 things you enjoy?

Through hard work and Boy Scouts, he turned things around.


The gym floor at Smith Center was so nasty and grim

What are all the lines on the gym floor for? Color the floor. Draw people playing a game on the gym floor.






Beautiful fireplaces in 'most every room

They make our home cozy with ambiance so vast!


Color the fireplace. Draw some other feature of the Smith Center that you like.

They bring things from our Wish List and dollars to share.


Color the symbol for giving. Draw another picture of giving or draw something you could give to the Smith Center.

To last one hundred years is no easy feat,


So many times, the outlook was bleak.

Draw or write an idea you have that would be good for the Smith Center.






In honor of Johnny Appleseed, we gather each year.

Oh, that festival across the street... can't wait 'til it comes.


How many apple seeds are in the J? Color the apple and draw some more.

They built Smith's large addition in 1932.








Mealtime is always a favorite part of our day,

The 1920's roared and our government banned booze.


Nellie Bly passed and Betty White was born,

Draw a picture of something the Smith Center should do to celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.






The Center was an orphanage when it first opened its door,

#### is for Personal Care Home


For the last 40 years, the Center has been Personal Care

Draw another picture of someone helping someone.






Just look 'round Ruth Smith; most things are in great shape,

There's friendship and laughter and activities to share.


Color the mansion like it looks today. Today's colors are the same as when it was built.

What is your favorite place to visit in Sheffield? Draw what you like to do or buy there.






These Methodist women take their mission to heart,

## is for Victorian


The Smith mansion is Victorian, the style of the day,

What do clients do at the workshop? Draw a picture of people working there or of something they make.






The Xerox in the office gets lots of use,

Our staff works so hard to make this place run.


Draw a picture of something else you would find in the Smith Center office.
